# Why ECE?

- High-quality early care and education (ECE) is a human right, yet 1 in 3 families in the U.S. struggle to find child care.
- California's workforce has shrunk by 10% since 2019, worsening the shortage of qualified ECE teachers and workers.
- ECE is a cost-effective way to improve school performance and raise graduation rates while also lowering rates of teen pregnancy and incarceration.

### The Challenge

- SSF's municipal ECE program is only partially funded: more than 700 working families are on the 4-year waitlist.
- The cost of living in San Mateo County continues to rise; the average monthly cost of preschool is \$1,800 per child.
- Experienced, qualified ECE teachers and workers are leaving the field to take better-paying jobs elsewhere.





#### Who We Are

We are a coalition composed of local teachers, ECE workers, care providers, parents, SSF residents, and advocates. Officially endorsed by teachers union AFT 1493 and the Peninsula Democratic Socialists of America (DSA).



## Why South City?

- Half of SSF kids aged 2.5 to 5yo have no access to affordable ECE.
- SSF's existing public preschool program is popular and more than ready to expand.
- The average ECE worker makes little more than minimum wage.
- Winning universal ECE in SSF will encourage other San Mateo County communities to adopt similar measures.



#### Our Solution

Dozens of grassroots volunteers gathered 5800+ voter signatures to put our measure on the ballot this November 8, 2022.

ECE 4 All SSF ("Preschool for All") will:

- Provide free ECE at the point of service.
- Pay all ECE workers a living wage, whether they're employed by the city or by licensed providers who have opted in.
- Tax the wealthiest corporations in SSF to raise millions every year for our children and working families.
